Reporting to the Administrator (CAO), the Public Works Manager is accountable for overseeing the effective management and performance of the Public Works Department. This includes capital projects, operations, and maintenance activities related to municipal infrastructure, fleet, and assets. The role involves developing policies and procedures, as well as providing oversight of departmental operations. The Public Works Manager also offers strategic advice and technical guidance to the Administrator and Council on a wide range of public works matters and is responsible for addressing inquiries and resolving complaints from staff, elected officials, and the community.

The ideal candidate will possess a Diploma in Engineering (CET designation is an asset) or a related field, or an equivalent combination of education and experience. A minimum of five years of relevant experience is required, including at least two years in the municipal sector, in a supervisory role or following completion of supervisory/management courses. The candidate must have a strong working knowledge of municipal infrastructure operations and maintenance, including materials and supplies, equipment operation, waste disposal, collection and landfill operations, road design and construction, surveying and inspection, and tender and contract administration.

The successful candidate will consistently demonstrate initiative and a commitment to providing exceptional customer service, handling all situations with professionalism and respect. Strong interpersonal skills are essential for building and maintaining collaborative relationships both within and outside the organization. Excellent time management skills are required, with the ability to prioritize tasks effectively. The candidate must be adept at analyzing complex situations and data, identifying potential issues, and developing both strategic and detailed plans to address them. They should be proactive in recognizing staff strengths and weaknesses to mitigate challenges.

Additionally, the candidate will be able to provide comprehensive guidance and training on approved practices and procedures.
